

PETE'S PEN


2024 finished strong at Niagara Christian Gleaners (NCG), and we were once again humbled by the countless lives that are being impacted through this ministry.

A record 1,635,631 kg (3,605,950 lbs) of fresh food was processed at NCG in 2024. This translated into 14.2 million servings of food aid which landed in 10 different countries, including Canada. None of this could have been accomplished without the blessings of God and the hard work of our army of dedicated volunteers. In fact, over 68,000 volunteer hours were needed in 2024 to transform all this great, fresh produce into life giving nourishment for those who need it most. It is abundantly clear that the success of NCG is dependent on the strong and collaborative efforts of our stakeholders. Our volunteers, financial supporters, produce suppliers, and distribution and transportation partners have integral and valuable roles to play as they contribute to the common goals of NCG. One woman said, "There's a lot I can't do, but I like to bake, so that's something I CAN do for all those hard-working volunteers." Another stated, "I'm a great believer in knowing you can do something that doesn't take up a lot of time (baking, volunteering) and together we can accomplish a lot."
